*N.Y. CONST. art. I, § 6:*

*No person shall be deprived of life, liberty or property without due process of law.*

*U. S. CONST. amend. V:*

*No person shall . . . be deprived of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law . . . .*

*U.S. CONST. amend. XIV, § 1:*

*No State shall . . . deprive any person of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law . . . .*
